From repairing pot holes, to fixing water leaks, to keeping up with day to day operations of the sewer treatment plant, to minor repairs to city buildings, mowing city property...and we could go on and on. These guys literally do it all.

Terry Frogue, Utility/Streets Superintendent: Terry is a 1985 graduate of Todd County Central High School (TCCHS) and started working for the city in 1987. After a short transfer to the Todd County Water District, Terry returned to the city and soon became the Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator. Terry was promoted to Superintendent in January 2001 and overall has 31.5 year in the utilities industry.

Justin Moberly, Maintenance Worker I: Justin graduated from TCCHS in 2008. He has worked for Haley's hardware for about 10 years and came to work for the City in November 2017. He is also the current Zoning Administrator, Code Enforcement Officer, and Floodplain Coordinator for the city.

Chris Orr, Wastewater Plant Operator: Chris graduated from TCCHS in 1989. He worked for Cumbee's Chevron and was part owner and operator of Orr's Tire and Alignment. He has worked for the city for 26 years. Chris is currently licensed for Class II Drinking Water Distribution, Class II Wastewater Collection, and Class II Wastewater Treatment. Chris has been married to Contessa Spurlin Orr for 25 years and has two children.

Josh Reynolds, Maintenance Worker I: Josh graduated from TCCHS in 2001. Josh previously worked in the maintenance departments for Western State Hospital and the Todd County Board Of Education before coming to work for the city in August of 2017.

Charlie Riley, Maintenance Operator II: Charlie graduated from TCCHS in 1985. He has worked for the city for almost 25 years. Charlie has been married to Amy Orr Riley for 25 years and has three daughters. Charlie holds a Class II Drinking Water Distribution license.
