Fire Chief Derrell Waggoner – Derrell has been a member of the Elkton Volunteer Fire Department since joining as a volunteer fireman in March 1979, serving the citizens of Elkton for forty years. He was appointed Assistant Fire Chief in 1994 and has served as Fire Chief since August 2014.

Assistant Fire Chief Daniel Smith – Daniel has been on the Elkton Volunteer Fire Department since 1997 after serving 13 years with the Farmington Fire Department in Graves County for a total of almost 33 years of service. Daniel is also a state certified Fire Instructor and has almost 2,500 hours of fire training on record. He worked 23 years as a fulltime EMS as an EMT, Paramedic and Service Director for Todd County. Smith also currently serves as Director of Emergency Management for Todd County.
