So just a little update of projects in the planning stage or the working stage:


1. Project completed at the bridge on Elk Fork Road.
2. Sidewalk repairs to start on South Main and continue around the city.
3. Update lights to go on the center field at the park, bid to be awarded.
4. Update large pavilion near the senior center.
5. Pennyrile Electric is working on a Park Beautification project at park with their employees and help from a Mission group of teens from Oklahoma.
6. New Grant written for Road project on Goebel Avenue.
7. Working to complete grant on some water line updates.
8. Completing a grant on the study of the sewer line.
9. Planning next phase of sewer repairs with grants and loans of several million dollars.
10. Seeking new grant from Delta River Region to assist in sewer.
11. Grant application with home land security to improve our electronic safety.
12. New grant for more lights and improvement in the Elkton-Todd County Park.
13. Getting to final stages of upgrading a generator at a sewer lift station.
14. 2019-20 budget complete with many areas of improvements included.
15. City policies are being studied and upgraded in phases starting with personnel.
16. City and County have several items in planning stage for improvements at the park.
17. Work on planning and zoning issues are always on the list of activities needing attention.
