Todd County has been awarded a Land and Conservation Fund grant in the amount of \$250,000 to build a soccer complex in Elkton for the youth of Todd County. The Fiscal Court will administrate the grant.

**Flooding:** The Council and Mayor continue to address this issue. The Council has approved a contract for an engineer to study part of this issue. Mayor met with Highway District engineer to discuss the issue on West Main street, tile have been cleaned on pond river road and more on-going work is planned. We cannot eliminate this issue but hope to make helpful improvements.

**System Water Leaks:** As previously reported, the Utility department is working to identify water leaks in our system and to make the necessary repairs. Their work is making progress with a 9.48% reduction in water loss last month. Thanks to the department employees for their diligent work.

**Contracts:** The city approved three contracts recently, one for engineer study of a flooding area for \$9,500, a contact for cemetery maintenance for \$38,900, and the second phase of sewer work for \$870,090. These contracts will help improve and maintain the city.
