The City of Elkton was awarded \$123,000 in Land and Water Conservation funds for upgrades to the Elkton-Todd County Park. The project includes installing new lighting at the small baseball field near the Senior Citizens Center and installing a new playground area.



The city will also receive \$400,000 in Transportation Alternatives Program funds! This project includes burying utility lines from Public Square to Mr. Guy Mallory Lane and replacing the sidewalks adjacent to the Post Office. The project also replaces sidewalks adjacent to Food Giant and improves flooding issues in the 500 block of West Main St by upsizing a storm sewer culvert .



Housing Rehabilitation: The city council approved the application process for a CDBG funding grant for housing rehabilitation in the city. Announcement of the sign up timeline and the availability of the guidelines will be announced in September.
