### Elkton Scattered Site Housing Rehabilitation Program

The City of Elkton, Kentucky is accepting applications for the Elkton Scattered Site Housing Rehabilitation Program. The program is funded by the Kentucky Department for Local Government with Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development.

This housing program offers income eligible clients the following activities:

- Rehabilitation—eligible major repairs of code violations to the home you own and occupy.
- Reconstruction—for a home beyond repair that you own and occupy

#### **Eligibility Guidelines**

Applicants must have a gross annual income that does not exceed 80% of the median income for Todd County.

Applicant must own and occupy the structures as your principal place of residence, you owe no county or city property taxes, you have current home owner insurance, you are not delinquent on any Federal loan, you are current on all credit payments the past 6 months and the structure has code violations or is beyond repair. You must have a legal title (fee simple) to the structure for which the assistance is requested. You must reside within the Elkton city limits.

#### **Types of Assistance Available**

A combination low interest loan and forgivable deferred load will be offered to eligible clients for the repair and/or reconstruction of their homes with major code violations. All applicants will be prioritized by a point system based on income level, the condition of the home, elderly, disable, have children living in the home, and veteran status. Priority will be given to those with the lowest income and are elderly, disabled, and/or a veteran.

The City, through the Department of Local Government CDBG Program, will provide up to \$100,000 per unit for rehabilitation/reconstruction. The cost of the rehabilitation/reconstruction will be in the form of a twenty-year forgivable deferred payment loan, which will not require monthly payments and will be forgiven at the rate of 1/20 per year that the owner remains in the property. Other financing option may be utilized, if necessary, to provide additional matching fund sources about the \$100,000 provided by the program. The additional funding required shall be the responsibility of the homeowner to secure and contribute toward the project.

# **Elkton Brush Pick-Up Guidelines**

Brush pick-up is a service offered by the City of Elkton, but we need your help to continue making this service possible. City Hall and the Utility Department need to set guidelines to better serve you and to set realistic expectations for brush pick-up given our limited resources.

- If you hire a professional to clear your property of trees or shrubs, make arrangements with the professional to take care of the debris as part of the deal. The City does not have the equipment or man power to handle large brush piles, heavy limbs, root balls, or logs.
- Brush piles must be manageable. Bundle limbs or brush with rope or twine, no longer than 6 feet and no higher than 2 feet. The weight should not exceed 40 pounds. For example, bundles should fit in the bed of a pick-up truck and be easily handled by one man.
- Smaller limbs, twigs, or vines need to be bagged. If you want to be green, use the paper bags designed for yard waste. These bags can be purchased at hardware stores and usually come in a bundle of five bags.
- Don't mix leaves and brush together. They are two different pick-ups. The vacuum on the leaf truck can't handle the twigs and branches and the men taking care of the brush can't get the leaves.
