We would also like to thank the public works and utilities clerk for your efforts to notify citizens of water leaks. Extra work was done by these employees to read meters and compare readings to find leaks caused by freezing

Cellular read meters: If you have a cellular read meter and have not set it up on your phone or computer, we can assist you with that function. The cellular read function allows the meter to be read every hour and will tell you when you have a leak if you have leak alerts set up. Radio read meters only get read once a month. If you do not have a cellular read meter and wish to add the read point, let us know at City Hall and we will provide the needed information.

Goebel Avenue work has been stopped until spring, at which time, street will be blacktopped, and the sidewalk work will be completed. This work will be a major improvement to the area.

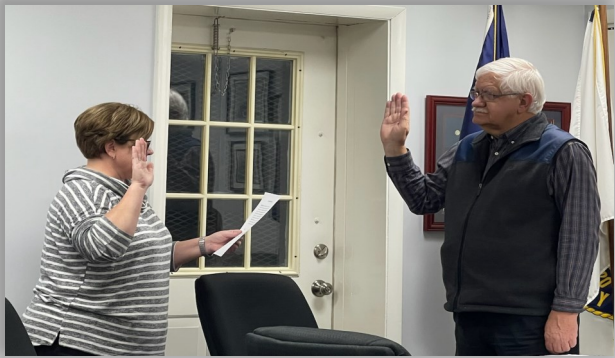

We are coming to the close of a four million dollar improvement to our sewer facility, replacing all water meters in the city, paving streets, and renovating the water tank on Morningside Drive. The City, along with the county, has also secured funds to make improvements to the Elkton-Todd County Park. These funds will provide new lighting to the baseball field and new playground equipment. There will be more funds added to build the new soccer field as well.

During the past four years, we have seen new apartments, new housing, and new retail business openings. We have a soon to be finished Cooperative Extension Office and start of a new library. There are plans in place for more housing throughout the city also.

With growth, there is always concern about change, but there are always changes taking place. So what is ahead for the next four years? Below are items that we will be working on in the city:

2. Sidewalk repair and additional sidewalks needs.
3. City Hall renovation will take place.

6. Updating of our comprehensive planning and zoning.
7. New section to our cemetery will be surveyed, cleaned, and landscaped.
8. Expansion of commercial property is needed.
