New Police Cars: The city just received five new police cars to update our fleet of vehicles. The city has entered into a three year lease for these vehicles. At the end of the three years, we have the option of buying or leasing more new vehicles. This leasing agreement will provide us with up-to-date vehicles and in the long run save the city money.

The cellular read function allows the meter to be read every hour and will tell you when you have a leak if you have leak alerts set up. Radio read meters only get read once a month. If you do not have a cellular read meter and wish to add the read point, let us know at City Hall and we will provide the needed information.

Transportation Grants (TAP): One of these grants is the work on Goebel Avenue., this project is set to be completed in March. We have another grant that we are starting that will be on West Main Street. This grant will include work around the Post Office, in front of Food Giant, and some drainage work. Our hope is to get this project ready to bid by the end of the year. We are also working to apply for another TAP grant to get some new sidewalks that are needed in the city.

Middle School Turn Lane: This road work has been approved. The state is in the final stages of design and we believe that this project should be in progress by the fall of this year.

Developments: The city continues to work with our developers in building new homes throughout the city. We have several homes that will be under construction throughout the year. We look forward to the start of the new library and the new assistant living in the spring.



City Activities



1. We are currently taking bids to build a new storage building at the sewer plant.
2. We are also taking bids for the maintenance contract for the city Cemetery. If interested in bidding, please call City Hall.
3. We are in the process of developing a contract to do a new city comprehensive plan update. This is a requirement by Kentucky law to update every 10 years.
4. A FEMA grant has been prepared by the fire department for 16 new air packs for the firemen. The grant is for \$156,800 with a city share of about \$7,500, if we are approved.
5. The current renovation of our sewer plant and lines has reached substantial completion. We should be able to close this project this month.
6. The city is studying the possibility of adding to our system the use of grinder pumps to address needs for sewer inside and outside of the city.
7. We are planning to survey our sidewalks to determine areas that need repairs, replacements, or needs a sidewalk added. This is a project that is much needed.
8. By the end of the month, the city will be bidding a project to remove old and damaged trees in the Cemetery. These trees will be replaced with new trees. In addition, we are going to make some other needed improvements such as section markers, etc.
