We are also evaluating our city streets in order to get estimates on the cost of blacktopping as much as we can afford this year.

The new library is taking shape, the new extension office has opened on Pond River Road, housing construction is taking place throughout the city. Citizens discuss the need for new businesses in the city. However, our main problem is that we have no available retail space for these endeavors.
